Context and objective

The objective of the LUMAT Conference “**Future Challenges of Integrated Land Management**” is to highlight the role of integrated spatial planning and the importance of urban regeneration for the prevention of urban sprawl and reduction of land take.

The expansion of built-up areas and the resulting land take has been identified as one of the key development problems in the recent programming period. Reducing the land take and reaching zero land take by 2050 are goals set both at EU and Member State level.

To achieve land take targets for 2050, planning solutions must include compensation measures and introduce effective environmental management tools already introduced in various European regions. The LUMAT project focuses on the importance of the action taken inside functional urban areas and the strengthening of spatial planning on regional level, which is proven practice of many countries.

The event is intended for professionals and decision makers at local and regional level. The conference goes beyond presenting the achievements of the LUMAT project; it is open to address the above challenges in cooperation with other experts, focusing on how to promote faster and, in particular, timely renovation/recovery of already built up areas.

Good practices and solutions will be presented by LUMAT partners and invited speakers.
