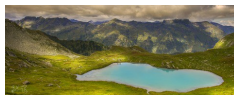

Partners overview



Naturpark Soelktaeler

Naturpark Soelktaeler GmbH is a Private limited company, at the moment there are two persons fully employed and one trainee for some hours. Proprietor is the private non-profit society "Naturpark Soelktaeler". Naturpark Soelktaeler GmbH manages only one nature protection area which is widely identical with the municipal area of the community "Soelk". Only some lower areas are excluded. The area of the nature park includes ca. 28.000 ha and stretches out from 694 up to 2747 m. The Naturpark GmbH has the duty to manage the nature park and to organize activities. The legal aims of Styrian nature parks is the protection of nature, education, recreation and local development. Nature protection is the basis of the three other goals.



Naturpark Soelktaeler Pilot Area

Established in: 1982

Surface area: ca. 28.000 ha

Municipalities: Community of Soelk

Main features: comprehensive visitor stream management and education of locals to increase awareness of the region and to be able to relay this knowledge to visitors(workshops).

Nimfea

Nimfea Environment and Nature Conservation Association

Nimfea Nature Conservation Association was established in 1993 as a non-profit association. At the time of foundation, the organization was characterized primarily by nature conservation and environmental education, then the scope of activities gradually expanded. The organization counts with 6 employees an annual budget of 200.000-250.000 euro and works in the following programmes: Biodiversity Conservation, Environment Protection, Sustainable Development, Democracy Development and Awareness Raising. The area managed by the Association is of about 600 hectares, consisting mainly of grasslands. Conservation management is focused on grazing livestock, which contributed to the maintenance of traditional landscapes as well as the preservation of biological diversity.

The Association also offers a tourism product, integrating elements of rural, ethno- and

ecotourism, with emphasis on environmental education. This offer covers several related services, within the close surrounding of the István Fekete Educational Centre, in cooperation with other local service providers, offering biking, canoeing, hiking and birdwatching tours, youth camps, workshops and conferences on different topics.

Authority for the Biosphere Reserve Southeast Rügen

The Authority of the Biosphere Reserve is a governmental institution of the Federal State of Mecklenburg-Vorpommern with the legal capacity to enforce environmental protection measures within the Southeast Rügen Biosphere Reserve. It is comprised of 30 employees including administrative staff, rangers, educational and project as well as regional development managers.



UNESCO Biosphere Reserve Southeast Rügen Pilot Area

Established in: 1990 and was incorporated into the World Wide Web of the MAB program in 1991.

Surface area: 22.800 hectares

Municipalities: Putbus, Göhren, Sellin, Baabe, Mönchgut, Zirkow, Binz, Lancken-Granitz.

Main features: Landscape and coastal forms of the Mecklenburg-Vorpommern coasts. Peninsulas and coastal promontories connected to one another by narrow strips of land. Fine, wide sandy beaches along the east coast alternate with rugged cliffs.

Realisation of the Handbook on succesful and innovative practices in Europe

Nimfea Environment and Nature Conservation Association has been in charge of the production of the **CEETO Handbook on succesful and innovative practices in Europe** (O.T.1.1), one of the first project outputs to see the light.

For the production of this handbook it has been paramount the involvement of project partners and other stakeholders as a knowledge basis that gathers and transfers success stories and contains existing management and monitoring tools, good practices and lessons learned across Europe and worldwide about sustainable tourism practices in protected areas.

The handbook contains an **analysis on current sustainability policies applied to tourism management** inside protected areas in Europe, an **inventory of existing planning, management and monitoring tools for a sustainable tourism** and identification of **successful case-studies worldwide**.

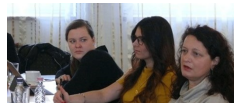
It also includes a report on the potential socio-economic benefits in applying a sustainable approach to tourism management in protected areas. Target groups and stakeholders were involved in data collection and in the survey on potential socio-economic benefits through questionnaires.

March 12th 2018 - CEETO partners hold their first Technical meeting in Budapest to identify tools to be transferred to CEETO regions.

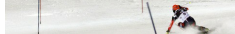


Emilia-Romagna Region meeting with Protected Area managers

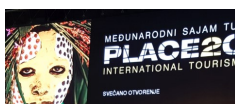
Landscape Park Strunjan at the GREEN Fair, Slovenia
