# About the NiCE Project



City centres across Europe are undergoing significant change. As online shopping grows and traditional retail declines, many urban spaces are losing their original function, creating both challenges and opportunities for transformation. At the same time, sustainable and circular ways of living remain often limited to niche initiatives, lacking visibility and accessibility for the wider public.

The NiCE project (From Niche to Centre – City Centres as Places of Circular Lifestyles), funded by the Interreg Central Europe Programme, addresses this shift by reimagining city centres as vibrant hubs for sustainable living. It promotes circular practices such as reuse, repair, sharing and responsible consumption, making them more visible and accessible in everyday urban life.

By testing practical solutions in **eight pilot cities** and collaborating with partners across Central Europe, NiCE brings circular lifestyles from niche concepts into mainstream reality. The project empowers municipalities, organisations and citizens to transform urban spaces into more resilient, inclusive and resource-efficient environments, with providing a set of ready-to-use instruments,

frameworks and digital resources. Developed within the NiCE project framework and tested in eight pilot cities, these tools help cities translate strategies into concrete measures, explore solutions, plan activities and track progress, ensuring that ambitions for sustainable urban development can be transformed into tangible results.

Within the NiCE project, a wide range of ready-to-use and tested solutions, tools and guidelines have been developed to support the implementation of circular approaches in city centres. These outputs are based on practical experience from pilot cities and are designed to be easily transferable and adaptable to different urban contexts. The key results and tools are presented in this Press Kit, providing a comprehensive overview of how circular lifestyles can be effectively introduced and scaled in cities across Europe.

## NiCE Project supports cities to transform their centers into Hubs for Circular Lifestyles across Central Europe

City centres across Central Europe are being reimagined as vibrant, sustainable and people-friendly spaces thanks to the NiCE project (*From Niche to Centre – City Centres as Places of Circular Lifestyles*), funded by the Interreg CENTRAL EUROPE Programme.

Responding to challenges such as declining retail activity, increasing online consumption and the need for more sustainable urban living, the NiCE project has developed innovative tools, strategies and pilot actions that support the transition towards circular lifestyles in cities.

Over the course of the project, nine partners from eight countries worked together to design and test practical solutions that make circular and sustainable consumption more accessible in everyday urban life. These efforts resulted in a comprehensive set of outputs aimed at municipalities, organisations and citizens.

Among the key achievements is the **NiCE Solution Box**, a collection of practical guides based on pilot experiences, offering step-by-step support on stakeholder engagement, development of multifunctional resource centres, linking sustainable e-commerce with city centres and water reuse strategies.

The project also introduced the **Circular Lifestyle Monitor Tool**, an instrument that helps cities assess their current status and identify opportunities for circular development. The **Strategy Framework for Circular Lifestyles in Cities** provides guidance for integrating circular principles into urban planning and policy-making.

To support knowledge sharing and replication, the **NiCE Knowledge Platform** and a **Virtual Exhibition** of more than 30 good practice examples were created, making project results widely accessible to stakeholders across Europe and beyond.

In addition, pilot activities implemented in partner cities demonstrated how circular approaches can revitalise urban spaces, strengthen local communities and promote more sustainable lifestyles. These experiences are documented in reports, blogs and videos, providing inspiration for further uptake.

The NiCE project shows that by combining innovation, collaboration and practical tools, European cities can successfully move from niche solutions to mainstream circular lifestyles.

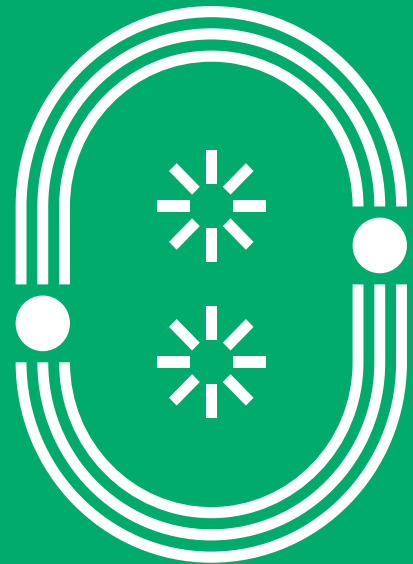
- The NiCE project and its developed tools help cities to promote and integrate circular lifestyle offers in their centres, making sustainable consumption more accessible in everyday urban life.
